Greenart

Winner of a Gold Show Garden award, the design for Greenart was devised by Jason Hodges, the garden constructed by Greenart Gardens. The garden was carved into a series of distinct spaces, one of them designed for teenagers. This area contained a hard court, a basket ball hoop, a contemporary graffiti-style feature wall and perimeter plantings of *Magnolia grandiflora* 'Greenback' to screen and soften the space.



Urban Cage

The annual Fleming's Student Design Competition is always hotly contested and this year's winner was Alicia Ferrer for Urban Cage. Alicia, a student at Perth's Challenger TAFE, created an outdoor living area designed to be primarily enjoyed at "seat level". The strongly geometric garden, which was constructed by Apex Landscapes, incorporates a suspended "grapevine" feature and a palette of green foliage plants for a lush effect.



Food for Thought

The Food for Thought exhibition garden embodied what is now a growing trend — the creation of a sustainable, food-producing home gardens. Co-designed by Chris Webb Garden Design and Wayne De Klijn of AQL Landscape Design, Food for Thought used recycled materials in creative ways, such as wine bottles called into action to create a decorative privacy screen, and edible gardens in raised planters. This garden was a very worthy winner of a Gold Show Garden award.
